


Location of Central European University

CEU occupies several buildings in a vibrant downtown neighborhood just blocks from the Danube:



The 2018 EAIR Forum will be held in the new campus of the university, located on Nador street 13 and 15. The entrance is through the Nador 13 building:



From Budapest Airport to you Hotel or to Central European University:

By taxi:

Főtaxi, the taxi company with the longest traditions (founded 1913) in Hungary, transports passengers between the terminals and Budapest. You can get a taxi at the Főtaxi booths located at the exits of both terminals. At the taxi rank in front of the stands, taxis are parking continuously waiting for passengers. A taxi ride to the city centre should typically cost around 7200 HUF (26 EUR) depending on traffic conditions. (Please be aware of exposing yourself at risk by using non-regulated taxi service providers soliciting inside and in front of the terminal buildings.)

Airport Minibus:

A very common and comfortable way of getting from Budapest Airport to the city center (or return way) is using an Airport Minibus. Reservations can be made in advance by phone at +36 1 550 0000 or by using the online reservation system (<https://www.minibud.hu>).


Public transportation:

There is direct bus line 100E connecting the airport with the city center that takes passengers to Deák tér, the major metro station in the very center of the city. The first bus leaves from the airport each morning at 05:00, and the last one at 0:30. Bus 100E stops at the BKK bus stop at the airport between the two terminals on the arrival level. On the way back to the airport, the bus leaves from Deák tér every thirty minutes from 04:00 to 23:30.

Passengers may get off the bus going to Deák tér at Kálvin tér and at Astoria. Bus 100E going to the airport only stops at Kálvin tér, but the first two in the morning will also stop at the Astoria M bus stop.


From your Hotel to Central European University:

Most of the hotels recommended by the forum host are within a walking distance to CEU. However, if you wish or need to take public transportation, the fastest and easiest way to reach the campus is by using one of the city's metro lines. The closest metro station to CEU is the Deák tér station, from where you can reach the university by a 9 minute walk:



Forum Social Dinner on Europa Boat (cruise along the Danube)

The Social Dinner **on Monday, 27 August**, will be held on the Europa Boat. The boat will depart from the Szilágyi Dezső square (on the Buda side of the Danube, so forum participants will need to cross the Danube through the Chain Bridge). Boarding starts at 7 pm, the boat will depart on a 2.5 hour cruise at 7.30 pm, will return to the shore at 10 pm)



Budapest public transport:

The public-transport system is good in Budapest. A wide variety of buses, trolleybuses, trams, underground trains (Metró) operate usually from 04:30 to about 23:30, and there are about 30 night buses.

Budapest has four intersecting metro lines at Deák tér: M1, the oldest little yellow line, M2, the red line, M3, the blue line and M4, the green line. At peak times trains run every two to three minutes and every ten to fifteen minutes at other times of the day.

Tickets are available at major metro stations, at newsagents' stands or from vending machines and can be used for all forms of public transportation. Tickets should be validated at the red or orange punch slots on board or at the entrance to the metro stations.

Budapest transportation tickets are valid for one journey travelling in one direction without breaks and cost approx. Euro 1.1.

Taxis

Cabs in Budapest are marked with the word "Taxi", often accompanied by a company name / logo such as "City Taxi". All taxi vehicles must have a yellow registration plate, as opposed to the white background on regular car plates. In Hungary the the price of the taxi fares are 300 HUF/Km (0.95 EUR/Km) in addition to the one-off basic fee of 700 HUF (2.2 EUR) and waiting fee.
