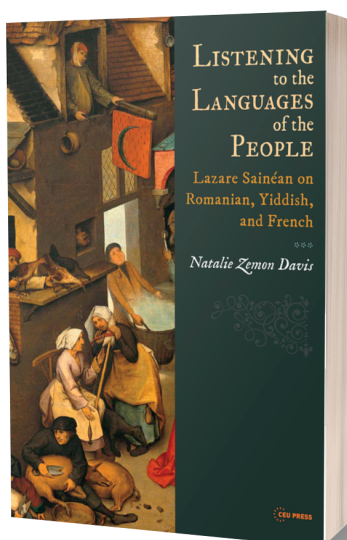

Natalie Zemon Davis is Henry Charles Lea Professor of History, Emeritus at Princeton University and is currently associated with the Department of History at the University of Toronto.

Her many publications include *The Return of Martin Guerre*, *Fiction in the Archives: Pardon Tales and their Tellers in Sixteenth-Century France*; *Trickster Travels: A Sixteenth-Century Muslim Between Worlds*, and *Leo Africanus Discovers Comedy: Theatre and Poetry across the Mediterranean*.

In 2010, she received the Holberg International Prize from the government of Norway for her work in the humanities. Named a Companion of the Order of Canada in 2012, she was awarded the National Humanities Medal by President Obama in 2013.
