Denmark, Poland, 2022, 116 min, Danish Director: Lea Glob

The talented Apolonia was born in an underground theater in Paris, and grew up in an artists' community — the ultimate bohemian existence. In her 20s, she studied at the Beaux-Arts de Paris, one of the most prestigious art academies in Europe. Over the years, Lea Glob kept returning to film the charismatic Apolonia, and a special bond developed between the two young women. The result is a fascinating portrait, spanning 13 years, of a young woman trying to find her place in the art world.

The Netherlands, 2023, 95min, Russian Director: Jessica Gorter

Deep in the forests of Russia, against the wishes of the authorities, 60-year-old Yuri Dmitriev searched for the mass graves of Stalin's era of terror, until he was arrested and sentenced to 15 years in a penal colony. Closely following Yuri, the film depicts the shocking ways in which the Russian state treats its citizens and rewrites history.

Ukraine, France, Poland, 2023, 100 min, Russian, Ukrainian Director: Alisa Kovalenko

In this seemingly bleak wartime setting, five teenagers ponder their future. They fully embrace the last golden hours of their childhood with energy, enthusiasm, and hope, despite their circumstances. They rebel, ride waves of adventure, walk into minefields, and sunbathe at a local lake. They dream of escaping not only war, but – like teenagers all over the world –small-town boredom. Will their dream of conquering the world come true when an unexpected opportunity takes them all the way to Nepal?

ŠTO DA SE RADI?

Croatia, 2023, 79min, Croatian Director: Goran Dević

Željko heads the union at a rolling stock company. His deputy committed suicide after a large public protest. Željko is torn between the guilt he feels over his friend's death and the expectation of his fellow workers to lead a strike that could thwart the government's plans to send the company into bankruptcy. This paradigm of Eastern Europe chronicles the workers who became losers in the transition; they helped dismantle communism, but failed to adapt to the ways of the new society.



THE OTHER PROFILE LE VRAI DU FAUX

France, 2023, 82 min, French, Lingala Director: Armel Hostiou

French filmmaker Armel Hostiou discovers a fake Facebook account has been set up using his name and image to gain female friends in Kinshasa. According to the fake profile, these women are invited to audition for his next film, which is supposedly set in the Democratic Republic of Congo. The filmmaker notifies Facebook of the identity theft, naively thinking it will quickly be resolved, but a few weeks later, things take a suspenseful turn.
