ABSTRACT

The First Elkana Symposium on Reimagining Teaching and Learning is a forum that brings together faculty, doctoral students, education researchers, and practitioners at CEU and across the Open Society University Network (OSUN) to share innovative and successful teaching practices as well as develop their own skills through workshops and training sessions.
